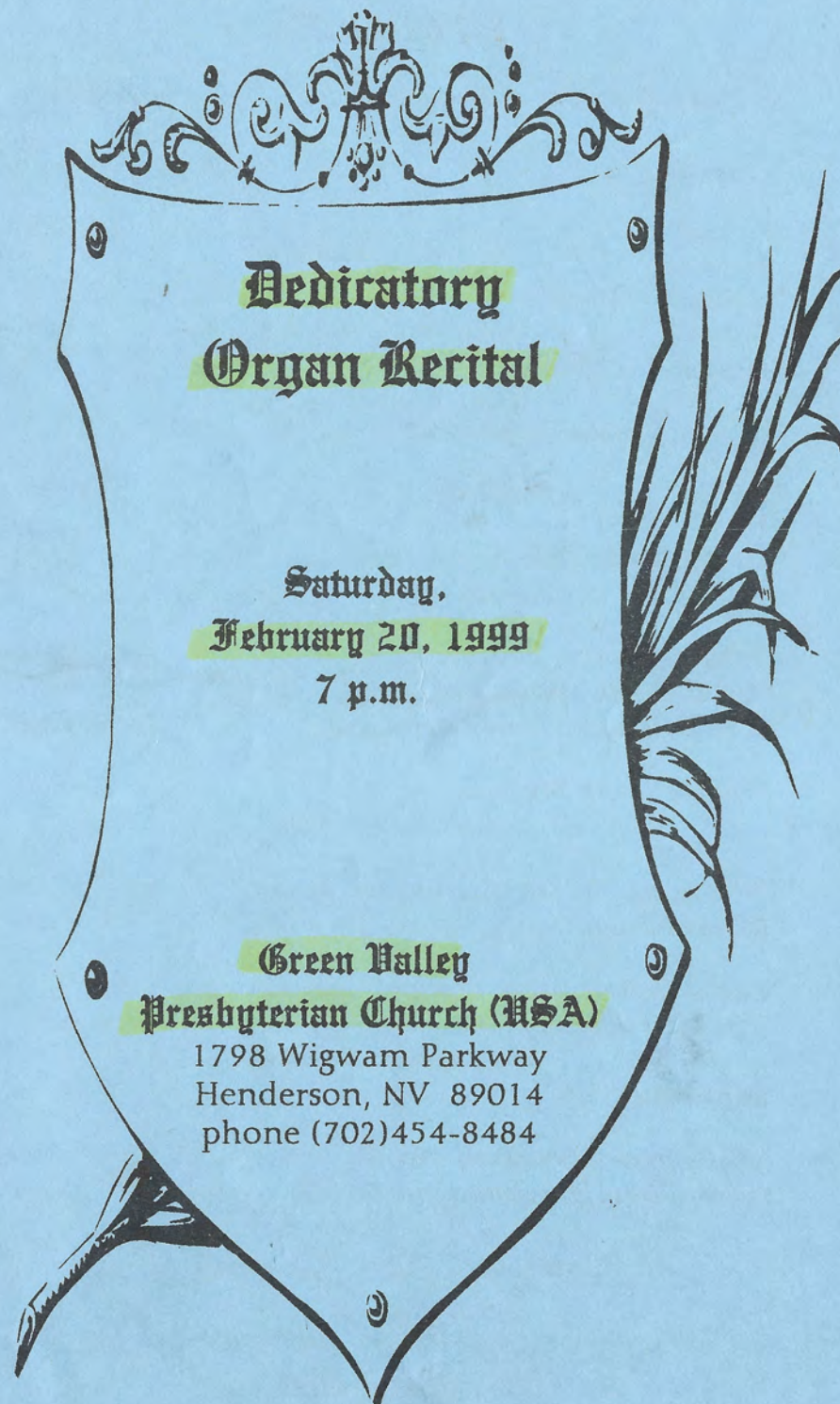

About the Organ...

The Rodgers 950 was installed and voiced by the Nevada Piano and Organ Center.

The Rodgers organ utilizes Parallel Digital Imaging, making it supremely adaptable. Rodgers' proprietary software-based technology, that revolutionized the digital organ world, permits each note of every stop of the 950 to be individually tuned, leveled and voiced after installation, just like a true pipe organ.

About the Church...

Green Valley Presbyterian Church is a dynamic and growing congregation established in 1984. Officially chartered as the Paradise Presbyterian Church, the congregation initially met in custom trailers on Harmon at Pecos. On April 1, 1990, the church was redeveloped as the Green Valley Presbyterian Church. From 1990-1994, GVPC was located in 3,000 square feet of leased shopping center space at Sunset and Eastern. The current church site in Green Valley was purchased in 1992 with the first phase, the Multi-purpose Building, completed in time for Mother's Day in 1994. The congregation has just dedicated the new Sanctuary, which was completed in January 1999.

GVPC offers a full range of Christian Education and Music Ministries as well as a host of other opportunities for fellowship, service and spiritual growth.

Mark Zwilling is currently Director of Music Ministries and Senior Organist of the First Presbyterian Church of Las Vegas. He oversees a program of over 20 choirs comprised of 420 people. Mark began the First Concert & Speaker Series for the First Presbyterian Church that brings nationally known musicians and speakers to the Las Vegas Valley.

Mark has been the guest recitalist for numerous churches and recital halls. He has also performed and toured under the auspices of the National Endowment for the Arts. He was the vocal coach for the MGM's production show EFX and helped put together Michael Crawford's newest recording, "On Eagle's Wings," released by Atlantic Records.

Mr. Zwilling is on the executive national board of The Presbyterian Association of Musicians and is the director of one of their national worship and music conferences that will be held the summer of 1999. He is on the Executive Board of the Nevada Chapter of the American Guild of Organists and holds three undergraduate degrees in music and a Masters Degree in organ performance from DePaul University in Chicago, Illinois.
