Representing the chapters were Hannah Brewer from Los Angeles, Victor Li from Orange County, Clayton Roberts from Salt Lake City, Keenan Boswell from San Diego and Charles Guiam from San Francisco. The firstprize of \$1,000 plus performances at the Region IX Midwinter Conclavein Tucson in January and at the National Convention next



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summer in Minneapolis went to Keenan Boswell, a student of Paul Jacobs at Juilliard. Second place prize of \$500 was awarded to Clayton Roberts, who studied with Dr. Kenneth Udy and will be at Rice University in the fall. All participants were awarded a year's membership in an AGO chapter. Judges for the final competition were Peter Bates, Dr. Orpha Ochse and Darrell Orweg with Fran Johnston and Dr. Williametta Spencer Serving as alternates.

CHARLES WESLEY'S 300TH BIRTHDAY TO BE CELEBRATED

Our second meeting of the season will be a celebration observing the 300th anniversary of Charles Wesley's birth. During his lifetime, Charles Wesley (1707-1788) (brother of John Wesley, the founder of Methodism) wrote more than 6,000 hymn texts. More than 5,500 of them were published in his lifetime. There is scarcely a hymnal today in all of Christendom which doesn't have multiple texts written by Charles Wesley: Episcopal, Catholic, Lutheran, Baptist, Disciples of Christ, Presbyterian, Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, Christian Science, and of course, Methodist. His texts such as ""O For a Thousand Tongues to Sing," "Christ Whose Glory Fills the Skies," "Ye Servants of God," "Come Thou Long-Expected Jesus," "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing," "Christ the Lord is Risen Today," "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling," "A Charge to Keep I Have,"

"Jesus, Lover of My Soul," "Soldiers of Christ Arise," "Come, Holy Ghost, Our Hearts Inspire," "Rejoice, the Lord is King," "Lo, He Comes with Clouds Descending," (plus more than 5,987 more!) are some of the best-loved and enduring hymn texts ever written.

Be certain that you come to this "hymn sing" on Friday, October 12 at 7:30 p.m. at University United Methodist Church. We hope that with a choir under the direction of Marshall Townsend and our own Margaret Hannah as the organist, you will help us make this an event to remember. The best way to insure a good seat is for you to volunteer to sing in the choir! At a rehearsal at 6:30 just before the event, the choir will prepare Eugene Butler's A Wesley Hymn Concertato for performance at the celebration. Invite your friends to attend with you. There is nothing more thrilling than fabulous congregational song!

ORGAN-IZING FROM THE PIANO

"Organ-izing from the Piano" is a program of the Southern Nevada AGO Chapter designed to introduce the organ to piano students in our community.

• Open to piano students of ANY age. All of the students in any piano studio, if they can play a piece, no matter the level, can participate.

• Only students and their parents from a single piano studio will be included in a given session.


• A professional member of the Chapter will "teach" the session which will include a brief explanation about the organ, the kinds of sounds available, some background of the particular pipe organ being visited, and questions and answers.

• The studio teacher will be actively engaged in the session.

• The major objective and major portion of the session will be devoted to giving each student an opportunity to play the organ. • The sessions are designed so that the student will have a chance to play the piece first on the piano and then, with assistance from the facilitator, perform the same composition on the organ. It's fun and eye-opening!

We can arrange the sessions in just about any part of the Las Vegas Valley, any time of the year convenient for the studio, and WITH-OUT CHARGE, of course. All we ask is that the students be well-prepared to play and have a good time. This could be an excellent activity to plan for students soon after they have performed in a studio recital. Between 10-20 students can be accommodated in a 90-minute session, and could consist of part or all of a piano studio. If there are more than twenty students who would like to come, we can arrange two sessions, perhaps back-to-back the same day at the same location. Teachers and parents and students have been enthusiastic about this program.
