

Organ Dedicated

At the 11 a.m. service Sunday the congregation of the West Charleston Baptist Church will participate in the dedication of their new pipe organ. Dr. Carlisle J. Sanford, pastor, will officiate at the service and Clarice Stuhr, choir director, will give a brief presentation about the organ. This four-rank organ with 328 pipes was built by Wicks Organ Company of Highland, Ill. The console consists of two 61-note manuals, a 32-note concave pedal and a stop board of 27 tilt-tabs conforming to the standards of the American Guild of Organists. Leona Singleton, church organist, will be at the console for this service.

At 3 p.m. a concert will be presented by Raymond J. Barnes, guest organist, who for the past nine years has been the organist-director of music at Trinity United Methodist Church and music specialist at

Ronzone School. He is a graduate of Adrian College in Michigan where he studied with the late Dr. James H. Spencer. He is past dean of the Southern Nevada Chapter of American Guild of Organists and currently state chairman. His program will consist of music by Purcell, Bach, Handell, and some contemporary works by Nyquist, Post, and Young. Refreshments will be served following the concert.

The public is invited to attend both services.
